## AT A GLANCE

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Daylilies are among the toughest perennials you can grow, thriving in nearly any well-drained sunny location with almost no care once established. The two real problems are deer pressure (especially on flower buds) and the need to divide clumps every 3–4 years before they become crowded and bloom-poor. For Long Island and similar deer-pressure zones, plan a repellent program from the day you plant.

## PLANTING CHECKLIST

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- Match site to sun requirements above before buying
- Test soil drainage — dig a 12" hole, fill with water, time it (should drain in 1–2 hrs)
- Dig hole 2x wider than rootball, same depth
- Backfill with native soil — do NOT amend the planting hole
- Water deeply at planting and weekly for first 3 weeks
- Mulch 2" deep, keep mulch 2" away from trunk/stems
